

About UNAIDS:

Serving Communities and Countries to End Inequalities and AIDS.

We, the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS, lead the global effort to end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030. By placing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) related to reduction of inequalities at the heart of our work, we lead the global response to AIDS by: (i) maximizing equitable and equal access to HIV services, (ii) breaking down barriers to achieving HIV outcomes, and (iii) integrating efficient HIV responses into wider health and protection systems.

MANDATE of the Department

The UNAIDS Multi-country Office (MCO) for the Andean Countries provides leadership and coordinates the integration of HIV priorities into the UN Development Cooperation Frameworks of Peru-Bolivia-Colombia and Ecuador.

Using a gender and rights equality lens, the MCO promotes the scale up HIV differentiated services focused on people living with HIV and key populations, including migrants and indigenas, at national and local level.

UNAIDS promotes effective use of strategic information to better understand and track the HIV epidemic and its trends, measures progress and support national reporting on sustainable impact of the response in Peru-Bolivia-Colombia-Ecuador. UNAIDS is also aligning itself with the main international commitments of the Andean countries in terms of gender equality and human rights (for example CEDAW, Beijing, Belén Do Pará, EPU).

It strengthens governance, operational capacities and political advocacy of civil society and community-based organizations of people living and affected by HIV, to actively participate in multisectoral spaces, engage in health, social protection, gender equality and human rights mechanisms. Mobilizes resources, promotes accountability, and provides technical guidance as necessary to national partners and policymakers.

Additionally, also the capacities and participation of women living with HIV and women in all their diversity, especially key populations and those in vulnerable situations are to be enhanced.

The UNAIDS MCO for the Andean Countries Office is working with IOM, WFP, OHCHR, UNHCR and UNFPA addressing the urgent needs of traditionally excluded groups of people such as key populations and people with HIV, including migrants and refugees, who live in severe conditions of economic precariousness, are exposed to food insecurity, face intersectional discrimination and xenophobia, and experience multiple legal and economic barriers to access to lifesaving HIV and health services.

Main tasks and Responsibilities

- Under the supervision of the UCD the incumbent has the following duties and responsibilities:
 - Support collection and analysis of national and international laws about gender equality and human rights
 - Analyze epidemiological information for advocacy briefs.
 - Develop draft notes for communication, webpage, and media (short stories, weekly updates, etc.).
 - Provide research support on access to health services, gender, legal and human rights issues relevant to the HIV epidemic.
 - Support the organization and monitoring of projects related to gender equality, advocacy and political dialogue, differential approach, women in all their diversity empowerment and prevention/care of Gender-Based Violence (GBV).
 - Participate in coordination spaces related to GBV and incorporate its focus into UN and UNAIDS core frameworks when required.
 - Support the development and revision of gender and human rights documents.
 - Assist in the preparation of meetings and events.
 - Support national counterparts with TA on gender equality and human rights.
 - Provide comments/inputs to draft documents.
 - If the intern wishes he/she is welcome to do a paper on a subject of their choice with the agreement of her/his supervisor.
 - Support collection of data for annual reports.
 - Prepare draft briefs and ppts for the Director on specific technical themes
